What?

Anne Frank was one of 1.5 million children murdered during the Holocaust. The Every Child Has A Name Legacy Project will remember these children through research and creative thought. The Project will run in conjunction with the special exhibit, *Let Me Be Myself: The Life Story of Anne Frank* at the Dallas Holocaust Museum. Students can visit the exhibit, learn about Anne and then research another child murdered during the Holocaust.

When?

Project Start: September 13, 2018
Submission Deadline: April 29, 2019

How To Research A Child?

1. Visit the [Yad Vashem Central Database of Shoah Victims' Names](#)
2. Go to Advanced Search
3. Enter a year of birth between 1929 and 1940 (This means you are just searching for children)
4. Select a child's name to learn more about him/her, including birth place, place of death, and more.
5. Use the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's Encyclopedia of the Holocaust to research your selected child's place of birth, place of death, and other locations on his/her record.
6. Create an artwork, poem, creative narrative, essay or other work inspired by the life and death of your selected child. Your work should be guided by the following questions:
 - Why did you select this child?
 - How did the child inspire you?
 - Why does this child need to be remembered?
 - What can we learn from this child's short life?

Project Requirements

- Must be an original project based on individual research of a child murdered during the Holocaust
- Must be on 8.5 x 11 in. standard paper
- Must be submitted online in PDF format at <https://dallasholocaustmuseum.formstack.com/forms/everychildhasaname>

Judging & Awards

Entries will be judged using a rubric based on artistry, creativity, originality, quality, and overall impact. Two entries from middle school (6-8) and high school (9-12) will be invited to a special reception to preview the new Dallas Holocaust and Human Rights Museum on September 8, 2019. Their work will be displayed at the new Museum.
